TRASH AND RECYCLING COLLECTION SERVICES**

**ADDENDUM #2  
March 13, 2019**

**Questions and Answers**

1. Can you provide me with your current costs for these services?
  - The cost for the current contract year for trash and recycling services is \$594,899.
  
2. Can you provide me with the current number of 65 gal containers that are out for trash and recycling and the current number of 95 gal containers as well?
  - The exact numbers would be difficult to nail down to the single cart, but here's a fairly close rough count.
    - Of the 5,690 assessed properties eligible (as identified in the bid specs), approximately 5,380 appear to be presently receiving service according to the following rough cart counts.
    - Trash:                    5,080 95-Gallon                    300 65-Gallon
    - Recycling:                5,200 95-Gallon                    300 65-Gallon (There are roughly 120 residences presently authorized for a 2nd recycling cart) 120 residences presently authorized for a 2<sup>nd</sup> recycling cart)
  
3. What GPS system is currently being used?
  - The Town has not specified nor does it have direct access to the GPS system being used. We are able to get information from the hauler related to it upon request.
  
4. The hand outs that you are currently using, are we able to copy those?
  - The handouts referred to paragraph II.B.2. of the Technical Specifications, page 40, are assembled and delivered with the carts by the hauler at start-up. The Town does not assemble this information package and doesn't keep it on file. This would be information provided to residents as described in the specifications, some of which is contained elsewhere in the specifications.
  
5. Can you please explain the last sentence in the first paragraph of Section II under Technical Specifications, Description of Work? "The Contractor may also provide a bid alternative for fully automated service for an alternate contract period."
  - The purpose of this sentence is simply to clarify that any alternative bid must be for automated service, though it may be for a proposed contract period different than the 2-year base period with 4 option years specified in the bid.
